Attendance: School policy states a student may miss one more class than the number of times the class meets per week. After that the instructor may withdraw the student for non-attendance. Roll will be taken daily. If you enter class after roll has been taken, please verify your attendance at the end of class.

Withdrawal Policy: Students who wish to receive a grade of W should complete the appropriate paper work prior to the last day to withdraw from classes. Students who do not withdraw from the class will receive a grade in the class. I reserve the right to withdraw students from class for consistent absenteeism.

Make-up Policy: Students are responsible for any work they miss. Assignments turned in late will have the grade reduced by 2 points for each day the material is late. Assignments two or more weeks late will not be accepted for credit. Out of class assignments for bonus credit will not be accepted late.

Lecture Classes: Tests are not made-up. If a student misses a test, the Final Exam will substitute for the missed test grade. Only one test may be substituted. Bonus credit missed by the student may not be made up. Students are encouraged to call when they miss class and to find a "class buddy" they can contact for notes and other information concerning class material.

Lab Classes: Quizzes may not be made-up. Opportunities for bonus credit will be given to offset a missed quiz. Lab Practicals can not be made up.

Classroom Behavior: You are expected to behave like the adults you are. Talking during lecture is annoying to those around you. Cell phones should be turned off during class or placed in vibrate mode. If you receive a call during class, leave the classroom to talk. Please be ready to take notes when class starts.
