Impatica

What is Impatica?

Impatica is a software application that quickly compresses PowerPoint presentations into a more web-friendly format that can be accessed by the widest possible audience.

Why Use Impatica?

Impatica quickly converts PowerPoint presentations so they can be viewed across different computer platforms at dial up modem speeds and without requiring PowerPoint to be installed on the viewer's computer.

Advantages of Impatica:

- Only three files are generated (much less than using the Save as a Web Page option in PowerPoint)
- Presentations cannot be edited by viewers
- Large presentations are easily viewed even when using a slow Internet connection
- Impatica compresses images, sound, and video
- A separate HTML file containing speaker's notes to accompany the presentation can be produced.
- More than one PowerPoint can be "Impaticized" at a time
- PJC has a site license

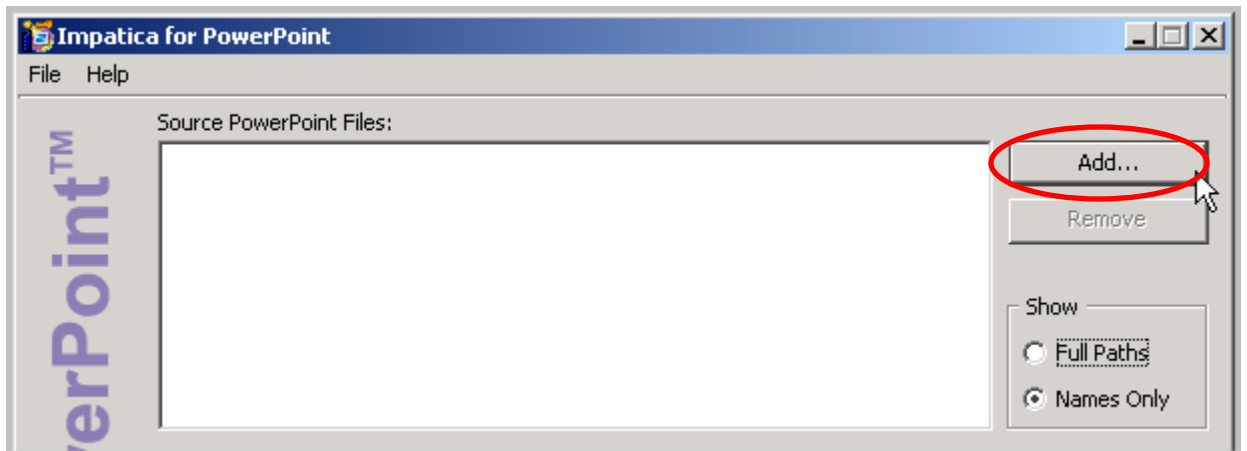
How it Works

Impatica converts a PowerPoint presentation including any associated sounds, animations, or video components into a compressed form. The presentation can then be accessed from a webpage, CD, or WebCT course where a small Java applet dynamically streams the content.

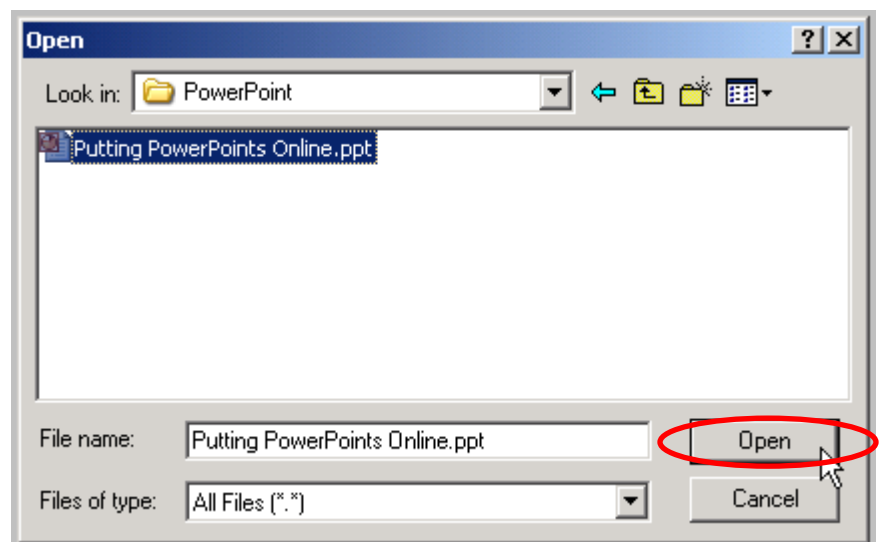
Converting a PowerPoint Presentation

To convert a PowerPoint presentation, open the Impatica software and follow the steps below.

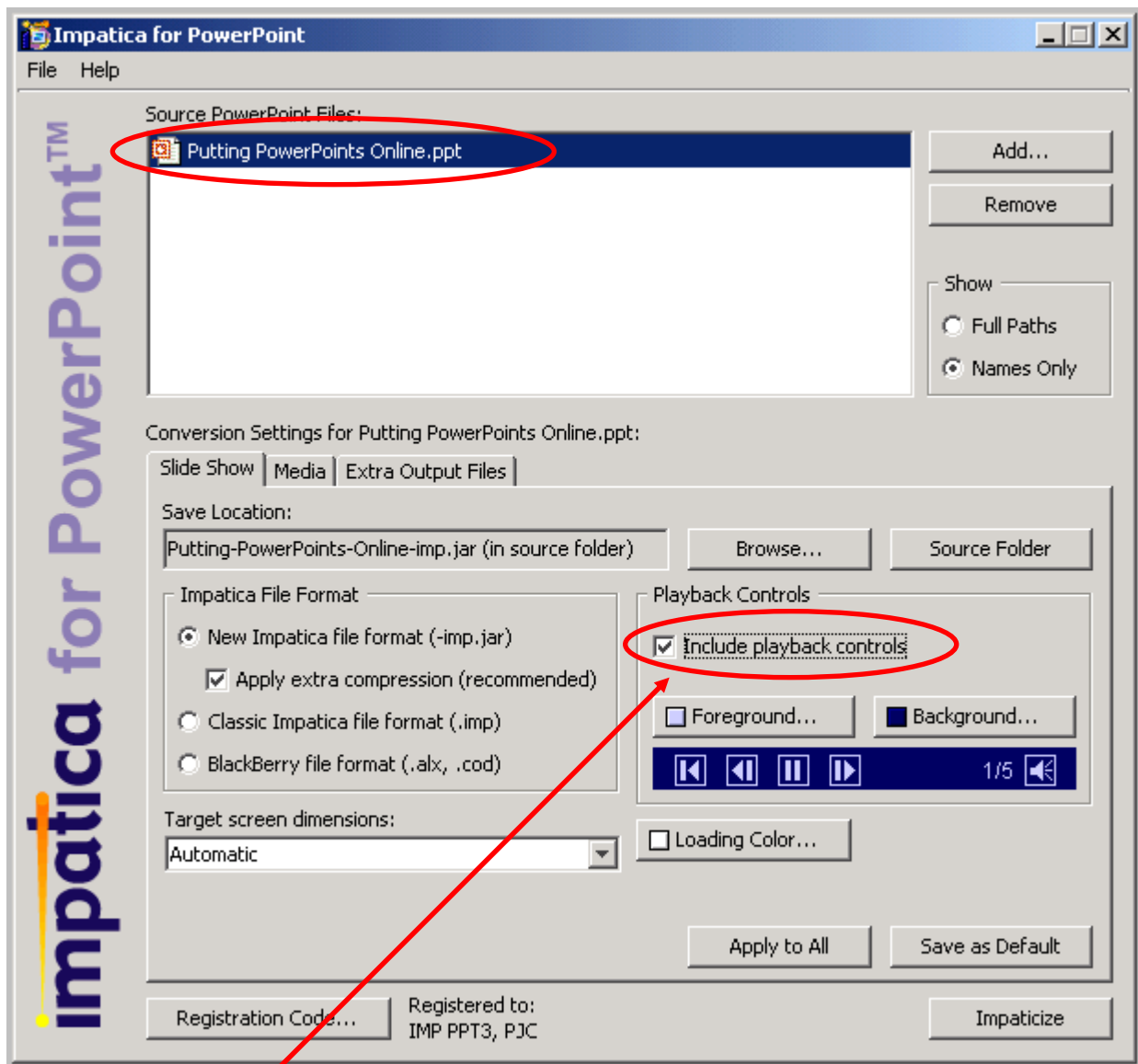
1. To begin, click **Add**



2. Locate your PowerPoint presentation, select it, and click **Open**

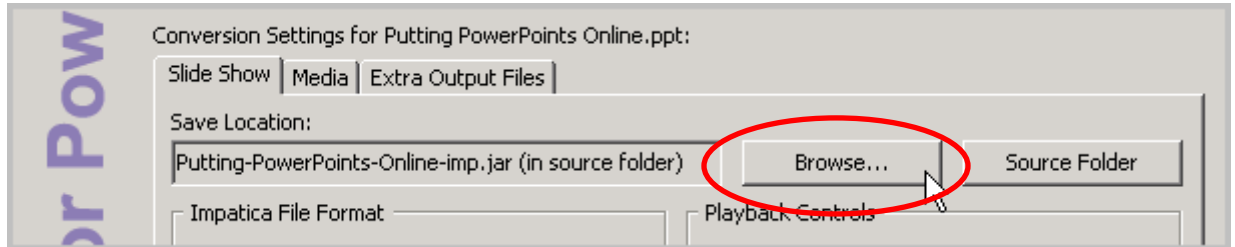


- The file name will appear in the Source PowerPoint Files window.

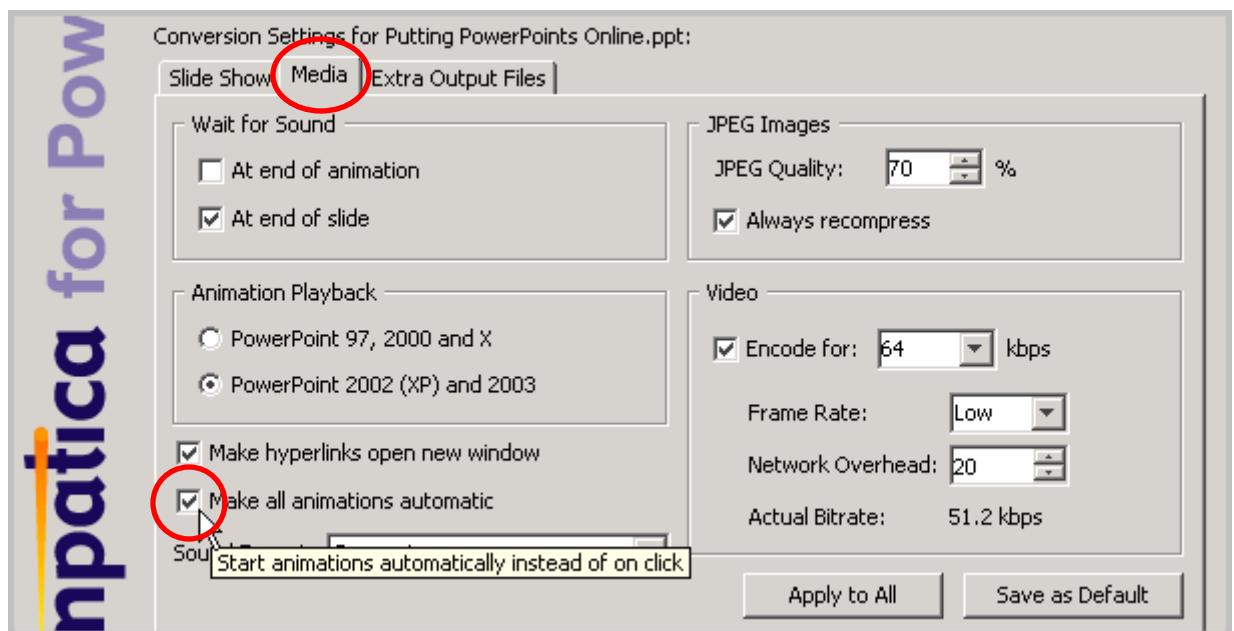


- Check the box to include Playback controls.

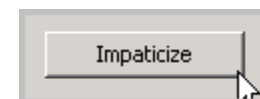
- By default the files created during the conversion will be saved in the same folder as the original PowerPoint file. If you'd like the files saved elsewhere, click the Browse button and specify a new location.



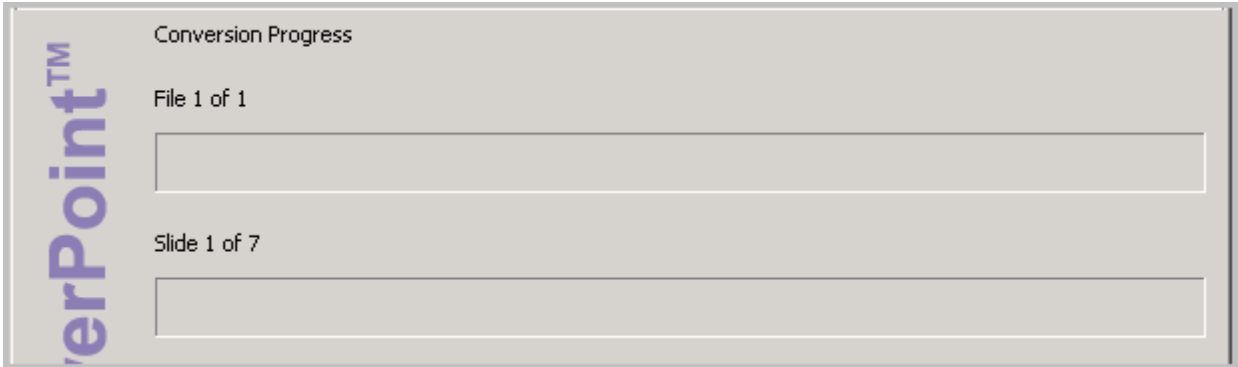
- To specify sound, animation, image, and video settings, click the **Media** tab.
- If you want the animations to play automatically, check the box next to **Make all animations automatic**.



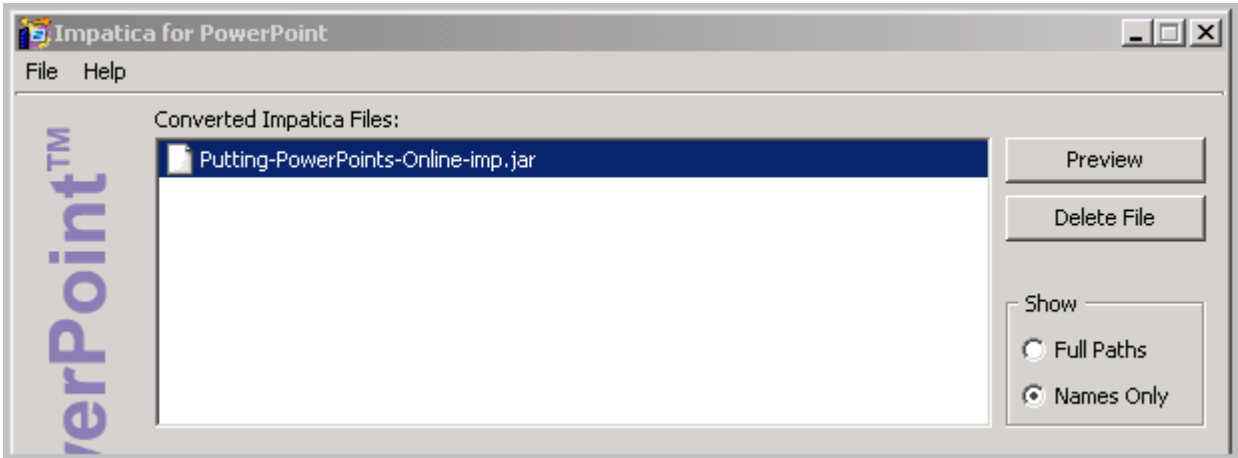
- After selecting settings, click the **Apply to All** button.
- When you are ready to convert, click the **Impaticize** button.



10. The Conversion Progress window will open and blue bars will indicate progress as the file is being converted.



11. When your PowerPoint has been converted, the new file will be listed in the Converted Impatica Files window. Notice the addition to the file name and the new extension. The **imp** addition to the file name indicates it's an Impatica file. The **.jar** extension indicates it will need the Impatica player (which was added to the folder during the conversion process) to be viewed.



12. Your PowerPoint presentation has now been converted.
13. To preview your file, click the **Preview** button.
